### **COUNSELLING:**

We provide a range of counselling services including:

### **TRAINING:**

We deliver a one year Certificate in Counselling Skills, which aims to provide students with the core skills to understand and apply the basic concepts of counselling together with the skills and knowledge required to facilitate a helping relationship. This course is part-time (one evening per week).

We also deliver a two year Diploma in Psychodynamic Counselling, which is accredited by the British Association for Counselling and Psychotherapy (BACP). The course focuses on three specific areas:

- psychodynamic theory and concepts
- counselling skills practice
- self-awareness and personal development

This course is supported by supervised clinical work, which is normally undertaken at Highgate Counselling Centre (HCC). Students are required to attend the course on two evenings per week.
