

WORKSHOP: SETTING UP IN PRIVATE PRACTICE

Saturday, 6 February 2021: 10.00-16.00

Making the transition from either training or agency work into private practice can seem daunting to begin with. This one-day workshop aims to de-mystify the process, and to provide participants with some practical tools in making this transition.

Topics covered will include:

- finding a suitable location and premises for your practice
- establishing an appropriate fee structure
- assessment/contracting with clients
- managing risk
- deciding suitable registration and professional membership options
- building your practice, including EAP (Employee Assistance Programme) work
- professional indemnity insurance
- professional supervision
- on-line marketing and your on-line presence
- record keeping and GDPR
- self-employment, taxation, allowances and financial matters.

The day will give participants ample opportunity to find out about the above and explore other issues that are related to the establishment of a successful private practice.

Facilitators:

Bonny Allyson is an accredited member of the BACP, supervisor and trainer. She has been in private practice since 2004 providing one-to-one counselling and supervision. She has worked with a range of organisations, including Turning Point, Centre 70, TPP and the Place2Be providing one-to-one and group supervision.
